Print this PDF on both sides of an 8.5 x 11 in. (letter-size) page, then follow these instructions to create a tiny book with a tiny story.

1. cut this top portion from the bottom "square".

2. Start with SIDE A facing you. it won't work otherwise.

3. This means flip over.

4. The shade represents SIDE B.

5.

6. Bring the "inner" flap around to the other side.

7. This means cut in these three places. Be sure to cut "completely" half way up or the flaps won't work right.

8. Crease the lower flaps where they meet the main piece.

9. This step is kind of hard to explain, but isn't difficult to do. Just fold the bottom left flaps to the upper right and the bottom right flaps to the upper left.

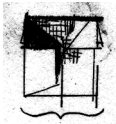
This is very important. The unshaded side means SIDE A, The shaded side means SIDE B. means crease, don't fold means fold in the direction of the arrow

Now try to read it. there should be 8 pages and 4 fold out flaps.

10. Voila!

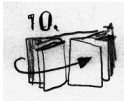

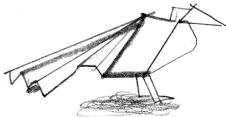
